WHO IS IT FOR?

We have room for up to 40 children aged 6-12 years of age.

Although our helpers are DBS checked, we ask that a parent/ guardian stays with their children for rehearsals and activities. If that is not possible, please contact us and we will make arrangements.

We will also have a few 'senior' choristers who will have been to Taste of Morland before and will be able to help the youngest members with singing and general activities.

WHO RUNS IT?



The weekend is run by Jen Allan. Jen has a BA in Primary Mathematics Education with QTS and teaches in a large Cumbrian primary school. She has sung with the choir at St. Mary's Church Wigton for the past 14 years and has also completed conducting courses at Sing for Pleasure.

You will be singing under the expert guidance of Emma Richardson. Emma grew up in Wigton, Cumbria before studying Music at the University of Huddersfield followed by training in Secondary Education. She is currently Subject Leader for Music at Dowdales School Dalton-in-Furness.



Emma has been leading Taste of Morland for the past six years and is thoroughly looking forward to returning again this year.
