A week of music and fun for all singers aged 9–17

Who is it for?

Morland Choristers' Camp is for children aged 9-17 who love singing. This week-long summer course offers a unique opportunity to experience the excitement of singing in a 100-strong choir and to enjoy a range of outdoor activities in the heart of the Eden Valley.

Where is it held?

In the picturesque village of Morland in Cumbria, close to the Lake District and just south of Penrith. Activities centre on the grounds of Morland House that has been the home of the Markham family since the 1820s.



What do we sing?

Both church and secular music covering a broad range of styles and time periods (a list of works previously performed is on the website). The morning and evening rehearsals provide opportunities for soloists, small groups and budding conductors. The week culminates in Choral Evensong in Carlisle Cathedral, a public semi-staged concert in Penrith, and Choral Eucharist in Morland Church.

What else do we do?

Have a great deal of fun whilst keeping very busy! The choristers camp at Greengill campsite in the village. Every afternoon there are outdoor non-musical activities which include dam building, sports and, Canon Markham's favourite game, croquet! There are five teams and a Challenge Cup is awarded to the team that gains the most points during the week from activities, duties and bonus points.



Our History

The camp was devised by the Canon Gervase Markham when Vicar of Morland and living at Morland House. Canon Markham was awarded an MBE in 2000 for his services to the camp; he remained 'Camp Chief' until not long before his death in 2007 at the age of 97. Our Chair of Staff, David Jones, has also been honoured with an MBE for services to Morland this year. The camp is now a registered charity and governed by a Board of Trustees.

The Staff

A special feature of the Camp is that it values its tradition of being an 'extended family' with many choristers returning year after year and so make friends for life. A number stay on beyond 17 and are valued helpers.

There are some twenty staff who have many years' experience of the camp and ensure the exceptional quality of musical tuition, pastoral care and individual attention which is given to every chorister. Most members of staff (including both Directors of Music) started their association with camp as children.
